



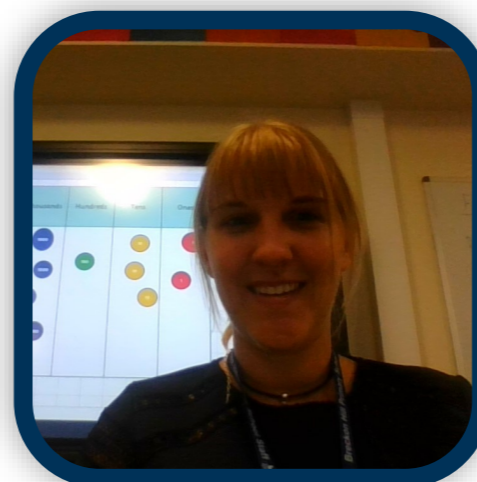

Keeping Healthy and safe

Handwashing: Children are asked to wash their hands when they come to school and regularly throughout the schools day.
