A message from the staff



Our electricity work will also link to our design and technology learning. The children will be asked to design, make and evaluate their own alarm systems based on their knowledge of electrical circuits.

As part of our learning in Art we will be looking at the Bayeux tapestry and its historical significance for historians. We will also create and make Viking jewellery, buckles and illuminated letters using different art materials.

During our maths lessons we will be securing multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12 so please remind your child they must practise these every single day.
