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Breckon Hill Primary School's action to address the cost of school day

Increasingly schools are asked to look at how they can make sure the school day does not put financial pressure on families. We currently have the following measures in place to help families with school costs.

- We have provided digital tools for a number of our families to enable children to engage with homework.
- Uniform: We ensure that we are ask children to wear low cost/durable uniform at a good price for our families. We have a selection of 'nearly new' uniform items which are made available to families from the community centre. We are often given donations of uniform which we are able to give to families.
- Pre-school: Children are welcomed into pre-school with a school jumper, free of charge.
- Resources: We stock each classroom with a full range of stationary items, there is no need for children to bring items from home.
- Trips: School trips and residential excursions are fully funded by school.
- Breakfast Club: We provide a free breakfast club each morning, which is attended by up to 60 children on any one day.
- After school clubs: As part of our wider curriculum, are free to children.
- Nationwide event days: We never ask the children to bring money for events, our aim is to raise awareness and join in. We sometimes ask children to bring an item for the foodbank at harvest time. We don't ask families to send children in dressing up costumes for world book day or wear red noses, instead we organise fun things in school to celebrate the day such as competitions and activities.

National Walking Month of May

In May each year schools all around the world take part in National Walk to School Month to help promote walking as a form of exercise that is good for your health.

The month long event is organised by the British Heart Foundation,

which aims to encourage fun events and activities in school to raise awareness and donations for the charity.

How to Take Part in National Walking Month

Walk to School - National Walking Month is a great way to leave your car at home, get outside and get fit by walking to and from school. If school or work is too far, try walking part of the way instead.

Join in walking a mile a day with your teacher around the school grounds.
Take the Stairs - Instead of taking the lift , take the stairs.
Go Exploring - Explore your local area, or enjoy a day out in the countryside, beach or park.
