Learning Contexts	Our Colourful World	Nursery Rhymes	All Shapes and Sizes	
Rationale (Why this/Why now?)	The children start to explore the Nursery learning about different colours and patterns in the environment. Many of our children entering Nursery don't know colour names and some do not speak English at home. Focusing on a different colour each week helps to secure a firm knowledge of colour and pattern. We will explore mixing colours, sorting colours and read stories focused on colour. Within the topic of colour we will look at everyday objects, animals, foods, etc to support children to extend their vocabulary and knowledge of the world. The changing colours of Autumn and winter will be used to learn about seasonal changes.	Children will learn, sing and act out a range of Nursery rhymes. This will allow them to grow in confidence joining in with group singing activities, learn new words and experiment with pulse, rhythm and rhyme. We will use Nursery Rhymes to explore weather and seasonal changes. As we near the end of the Spring term we will use the Nursery Rhymes to focus on new life in animals and plants and link this into our Summer topic on shapes and sizes.	Building on the Autumn terms work on colour and pattern, the children will begin to names shapes and identify them in the environment.t They will begin to compare shapes and sizes and begin to think about how they have grown and changed in Nursery. We will also look at other living things and how they grow and change in the summer in preparation for further work on life cycles in Reception and linked to our previous work on seasonal changes.
