# 15 Enjoy Forest School In All Weather!



#### **Attendance at School**

When children attend school consistently they are more likely to do well in their work but also build strong relationships. It also shows a reliability which will help prepare children for life beyond education. By law, parents are responsible for ensuring all children of compulsory school age attend school or are educated at home. If your child misses school for at least 10% of the time they will be classed as persistently absent, which is treated seriously (unless there is a valid reason such as serious illness). Parents can be fined or even prosecuted.

#### Types of absence

**Unauthorised Absence** There are times when children are absent for reasons, which are not permitted. These are known as "unauthorised absences". Examples of unauthorised absence are: Waiting for a delivery

Taking or collecting a relative to/from the airport

Going for a family day out

Sleeping in after a late night

Going shopping or for a haircut, uniform, shoes

Because it is your child's birthday or any other family member's birthday

Term time holiday/cheap flights/visiting family Family weddings

Parent's or grandparent's illness

Where there is no explanation for an absence or where the explanation or reason for the absence is considered unsatisfactory, absence will be recorded as 'unauthorised'. Continued unauthorised absence can lead to legal procedures against parents and this may mean parents are issued with a penalty notice fine or even a summons to the magistrate's court. Authorised absence — You must apply for permission and school may also request further evidence to support the reasons.

If your child is too ill to attend, please let us know. It's important to stay in touch with the school so we can work with you to minimise disruption to your child's learning.
