Step 2
If needed, you will be offered treatment and if you qualify, this will be given free of charge.

Step 3
A suitable medicine may be offered to you.*
*You qualify for free treatment if you do not pay for your prescriptions.

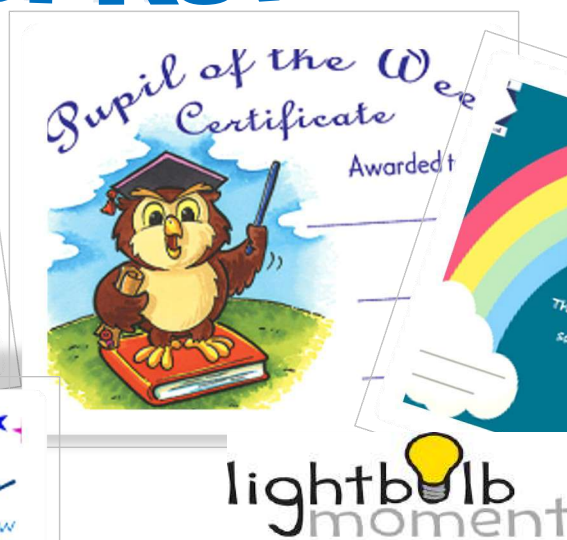

The shop also has clothes and household goods.

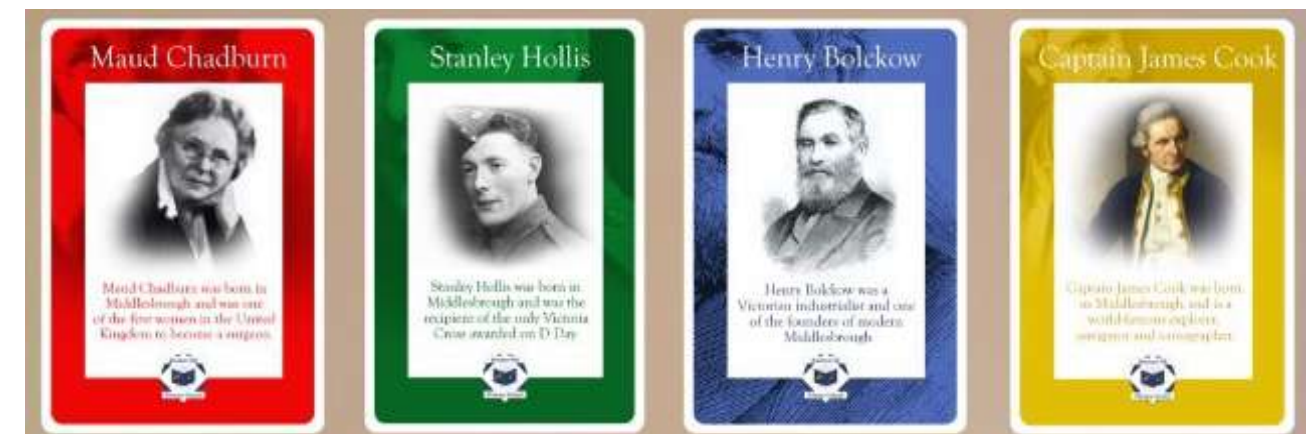

How does attendance affect outcomes for pupils?

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

Research found that pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well.

Data also shows that in primary school children in Key Stage 2 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.

Leave of absence

Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances, visiting family and friends along with birthdays is not an exceptional circumstance.

Any applications for leave of absence must be made two weeks prior to intended time of absence. Please don't book your holiday during term time. Parents may be fined for taking unauthorised absence.
