As always, please don't hesitate to contact us should you want to ask any questions.




## This term we will be learning...

Who was involved in the struggle for the Kingdom of England?

This is a full term's topic where the children's main focus is history. The children will explore and find out why the Anglo Saxons invaded Britain and why they settled here for so long?

We will explore historical evidence to find out about the peoples living in northern Britain at the time of the Anglo-Saxons: the Picts and the Scots. We will be finding out what was life like in an Anglo-Saxon village.



### We will be learning about the amazing find at Sutton Hoo

Sutton Hoo is a series of large mounds in East Anglia. In 1939 a local

archaeologist excavated the biggest mound and found an Anglo-Saxon ship buried there. The ship is believed to have belonged to an Anglo-Saxon King due to the wonderful artefacts found during the excavation.

In Science the children will learn to construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers. They will also recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit.
